## Educational Excellence in a Caring, Christian Community

Founded in 1954, Chiang Mai International School (CMIS) is an independent, co-educational, non-profit day school for students from Preschool to Grade 12.

CMIS provides high quality education in a caring, social, and cultural environment. Built on a tradition of providing educational excellence in a caring community, CMIS has been helping meet the educational needs of the international community in Northern Thailand for over 65 years.

CMIS offers an English-language, American-sourced education taught from an international perspective. Our well-qualified teachers provide instruction that is aligned to a standards-based curriculum focused on active learning. The academically rigorous Advanced Placement (AP) courses offered in our high school help prepare our graduates for admission to outstanding universities and colleges around the world.

CMIS students grow to become confident, articulate, globally-minded learners who excel in many areas, including the arts, athletics, academics, community service, and leadership. This tradition has resulted in CMIS being known to many as the best international school in Chiang Mai.

Today, CMIS is a dynamic international school with over 500 students from more than 23 different countries, but is still small enough to retain a friendly and relaxed campus environment. It also remains true to the traditions of its founders, serving missionary families and maintaining the heritage and values of the Christian faith at the heart of the school.

## Administration and Faculty

CMIS is owned by the Church of Christ in Thailand (CCT), a national Protestant organization, and governed by an eight-member Board of Directors appointed by the CCT. CMIS is licensed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The day-to-day activities of the school are run by the School Executive Team composed of the Manager-Director and the Head of School

Our teachers and administrators are highly qualified professionals from twelve countries, including Australia, Canada, France, India, New Zealand, People's Republic of China, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, Thailand, the U.K., and the U.S.A. Our educators are certified teachers with more than half holding advanced degrees.

## Professional Affiliations

CMIS has held legal status with the Thai Government as an international school since 1985, and has been accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) since 1987 CMIS is a member of the East Asia Regional Council of Overseas Schools (EARCOS), the International Schools Association of Thailand (ISAT), and the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS). In addition, CMIS has sponsored a local chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS) since 2016.



## A Diverse, International Community

At CMIS, we celebrate our ethnic and cultural diversity. Our students have historic and cultural connections to many different countries, speak multiple languages, and often hold more than one passport. We strive to maintain a culturally diverse student body, adding to the richness of the international educational experience. At present, our ethnic diversity can be described as follows: Thai (36\%), Chinese (21\%), Dual Citizens (19\%), American (9\%), Korean (8\%), Australian (1\%), Canadian (1\%), Indian (1\%), Swedish (1\%), UK (1\%), Others (2\%).

Those Dual Citizens (19\% of our student body) represent 22 different passport countries. The nationalities of the parents of those Dual Citizens include: American, Australian, British, Canadian, Chinese, Danish, Dutch, Hong Kongese, Indian, Japanese, Malaysian, New Zealander, Nigerians, Omani, Singaporean, South Korean, Spanish, Swedish, Swiss, Taiwanese, Thai, and Turkish.

## Total Enrollment

Chiang Mai International School is committed to differentiated instruction and small class sizes. Each class is taught by one foreign teacher. All Preschool to Grade 2 classes are also staffed with an additional instructional aide. During the 2020-2021 academic year, CMIS was operating at optimum capacity.

## Admission to CMIS

Application to CMIS is competitive. All students must have a comprehensive level of English language proficiency before they may be considered for enrollment. The primary conditions for acceptance are academic eligibility, English language proficiency, and exemplary behavior. We can accept a limited number of academically qualified non-native English speakers. We can also accept a limited number of students with mild learning disabilities, provided there is space available.

## Application Process

Applicants and enquirers are encouraged to register their interest, schedule an appointment for a school visit, and to complete their application electronically. ## Application Season

Elementary School and Middle School students may apply for enrollment at any time throughout the semester, provided that appropriate vacancies exist. High School applications may be considered for enrollment up until the second week of the semester. Applications received after the cut-off dates will be asked to delay their enrollment until the start of the following semester.

## Entrance Assessments

Applicants for entry into Preschool to Grade 12 are given age appropriate assessments to determine math and English language proficiency and eligibility. The English assessments cover the four language domains of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Both the math and English assessments are administered in English without translation or outside assistance.



## Curriculum

CMIS provides instruction that is closely aligned to an American standards-based curriculum. It also builds upon the diversity of our students and teachers by incorporating programs and best practices from around the world.

The school year is divided into two semesters; the first running from August to December, with the second running from January to early June. There are 180 instructional days, with a week break in October, an extended break during late December and a break in April. School begins at 7:40 AM and ends at 2:35 PM.

## Preschool

CMIS Preschool is a full-day program with small class sizes. It is divided into two separate classes of 4-year-olds. Each class is attended to by one homeroom teacher and an instructional aide. Recognizing that young children learn best through play, CMIS uses the inquiry-based Creative Curriculum.

We promote our students' social and emotional development through creative play by showing them how to deal with their emotions and maintain positive relationships in their new school environment. Students practice pre-reading, pre-math, and writing skills, while also enjoying art, music, library, physical education, and Thai language \& culture classes outside their regular classroom.

## Kindergarten

CMIS Kindergarten operates as a full-day program that targets the core curricular areas of language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. Our program involves center-based learning which includes hands-on activities and small group instruction. Students also participate in elective classes outside of the Kindergarten classroom including art, music, library, physical education, and Thai language \& culture.

## Elementary School

CMIS Elementary School is dedicated to providing a vibrant learning environment which is student-centered, engaging, and aimed at developing the whole child. Our child-friendly program, with its small class sizes and differentiated instruction, provides each child with the tools required to reach their academic, emotional, and social potential.

In Grades 1 to 5, CMIS uses curriculum standards and benchmarks, such as Common Core (American) State Standards for Literacy and Mathematics, Next Generation Science Standards, and C3 (College, Career and Civic Life) Social Studies Standards. The standards-based curriculum provides a rigorous and developmentally appropriate program of study. Students are instructed by homeroom teachers in core subjects, and by specialist teachers in art, music, library, physical education, and Thai language \& culture.

We care deeply about each of the families that we serve and strive to ensure that each child develops into a happy, confident, and caring member of our learning community. Technology and information literacy are integrated throughout the curriculum and teachers have laptops available to supplement class instruction and activities.

## Middle School

CMIS understands that the middle school years can have a profound impact upon the cognitive, social, and emotional lives of young teens. To help students with this transition, we have developed a school model that includes mentor relationships between teachers and students, the creation of small communities of learners, and community outreach projects. Our middle school includes instruction in the core subjects of English, mathematics, science, social studies, wellness, P.E., world languages, and offers elective subjects including art, computers, music, drama, and independent study projects. All students are provided with a laptop and authentic opportunities to use technology in their core subjects and electives.

## High School

Our American, standards-based curriculum provides a college-preparatory education in English, suitable for entry into colleges and universities throughout the world. Our high school curriculum in Grades 9 to 12 includes instruction in the core subjects of English, mathematics, science, social studies, P.E., and world languages. CMIS high school also offers elective subjects including health, art, computers, music, dance, drama and independent study projects. Students in Grades 10 to 12 are given the opportunity to undertake various first year college-level courses through the Advanced Placement (AP) program. Technology and information literacy are integrated throughout the curriculum, requiring that every student have a laptop.


## Student Supports

CMIS recognizes the importance of supporting student's social, emotional, physical, and spiritual development. Our support teams consist of student success, guidance counselors (Elementary School, Middle School, and High School), school nurses, and a spiritual advisor. These teams work alongside teachers and administrators to assist and encourage students in reaching their full academic and personal potential.

CMIS will provide academic support for struggling students through our Student Success Team (SST), as needed. SST is a group of certified individuals who help assist students with learning differences. Teachers can fill out a form and SST will be notified of the student's needs. SST will then observe the student in the subject that they are having difficulty in, and determine the best way to ensure success.

We are equipped to manage and support students who have diagnosed learning differences. According to ADA standards, these students will receive accommodations to best suit their learning needs as outlined in an IEP or 504 plan generated by the school. Two models of assistance can be provided by SST; inclusion, and resource. Inclusion support looks like an SST teacher entering the students classroom to help and implement specifically designed instruction (SDI). Resource support removes the student from the general education setting for more specific 1:1 instruction. At CMIS, we are committed to helping every student succeed!

## Counseling

The CMIS School Counseling Program follows The International Model developed by the International School Counselor Association. In congruence with the International Model, CMIS counselors endeavor to "impart specific skills and learning opportunities in a proactive, preventative manner, ensuring all students can achieve school success through academic, career, personal/ social and global perspective experiences." The counseling department includes the ES, MS, and HS counselors working as a team to ensure that all students have access to the support they need. At CMIS, the counselors design programs and services to meet the needs of students at various growth and developmental stages. We help students establish goals and meet expectations while offering support systems and experiences for all students.

## Parent Teacher Group (PTG)

All teachers, administrators, parents, and guardians are automatically members of the Parent Teacher Group (PTG). This dynamic and involved group at CMIS promotes communication, cooperation, understanding, and collaboration between groups within the school, as well as in the wider community. The PTG welcomes and encourages all parents and teachers to take an active role in the school by attending monthly meetings and by volunteering time, resources, and abilities in order to make CMIS the best place that it can be for our students. The PTG coordinates social events, raises funds to support school programs and activities, and each year awards a scholarship to a deserving Grade 12 graduate. The CMIS Booster Club operates as an integral part of the PTG, raising funds and helping support extra-curricular programs and activities.



## External Student Assessment

CMIS evaluates students' progress in achieving the learning standards in the curriculum, by requiring that students in Grades 2 to 10 take the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) test to measure development in the academic standards in mathematics, science, language and reading. MAP data has consistently indicated that CMIS students surpass the international norms.

Additionally, Advanced Placement (AP) exams are given in several high school subjects every year. CMIS students have consistently outranked comparable international schools in AP scores since 2010.

CMIS is a local testing center for the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT), Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and SAT Subject Tests. Our school's CEEB/ACT (College Board) Code number is 695408. All students in grades 8 to 10 take the PSAT.

## COMMUNITY

In the 2020-2021 academic year, our high school (Grades 9 to 12) consisted of 150 students from 21 different countries. We currently have 25 high school faculty members. Our international faculty come from a variety of countries including Canada, China, France, India, Myanmar, South Africa, Sweden, Thailand, U.K. and the U.S.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Our American, standards-based curriculum includes instruction in the core subjects of English, mathematics, science, social studies, and world languages (Thai, French, Spanish, and Mandarin Chinese). CMIS also offers elective subjects including: Studio Art, 3D Art/Sculpture, Theater Arts, Band, Dance, Digital Graphics, Film \& Storytelling, Physical Computing \& Robotics, Writing with Style, US History, Philosophy, Current Events, Comparative Government, Business Studies, Strength \& Fitness, and a variety of Advanced Placement courses including the AP Capstone. The school year consists of two semesters. High School classes are organized on a six period per day, 8-block rotating schedule. Each course meets for 55 minutes. All Grade 9 to 12 students must take a minimum of 7 instructional classes per semester. All CMIS high school students are provided with laptops and are given authentic opportunities to use technology in their classes.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

Students in Grades 10 to 12 are given the opportunity to undertake various first year college-level courses through the Advanced Placement (AP) program, which may vary from year to year, based on student interest and teacher availability. Students are encouraged to take at least 3 AP courses before graduation, although it is recommended that they NOT take more than 3 AP classes at the same time.

## AP EXAMS

In May 2021, 102 students took 191 exams and 90\% achieved a score of 3 or higher. CMIS has historically outranked comparable schools worldwide in AP scores.


Test scores in the above summary for the years 2019, 2020, and 2021 were calculated for tests administered at CMIS using data available from College Board. College Board has stopped providing summary information for global and Thailand test takers since 2019.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to receive a CMIS High School Diploma, students must successfully complete the required course of study. A minimum of 50 credits are required for graduation. (Students may transfer no more than 14 credits per year from another school.) One credit is awarded for each one-semester course completed with a passing mark of D- or above. Students are also required to complete 60 hours of service learning while in high school.

Students must meet all CMIS graduation requirements for P.E., Health, Computer Science, Visual \& Performing Arts, and Senior Seminar. Courses taken over and above the required credits in any single subject area are considered elective credits. US History is recommended for all US Citizens. All students must complete two years in one (the same) world language in Grades 9 to 12. Thai $G / L$ is a required course for all Grade 9 to 12 students of $100 \%$ Thai nationality. All Thai nationals must take a Thai language class each year.

## GRADING SCALE

The grading scale with the Letter Grade, Numerical Score, and Grade Point Average (GPA) equivalents is listed below. Cumulative grade point averages are determined by dividing the total number of grade points a student has earned by the total number of credits they have taken. All academic courses, including electives and AP courses, are included when calculating the GPA.

## SAT RESULTS

CMIS students take the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) in Grades 11 and 12. According to the prep scholar website, a good score for a college-bound student is at or above 1,000. An excellent score (top 25\%) falls at or above 1,200 . For the past five years, the average mean score of CMIS SAT-takers has fallen within the range of college-bound students. ## AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA PROGRAM

CMIS offers students the opportunity to pursue an AP Capstone Diploma AP Capstone ${ }^{T M}$ is a College Board program that equips students with independent research, collaborative teamwork, and communication skills. It cultivates curious scholars and prepares them to make logical, evidence-based decisions. AP Capstone comprises two AP courses, AP Seminar and AP Research, and is designed to complement and enhance the discipline-specific study in other AP courses.

Seven students from the class of 2021 earned the AP Capstone diploma.

## HONORS DIPLOMA

CMIS offers an "Honors Graduation Diploma" for students who successfully complete a minimum of three AP courses while maintaining a Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.5.

The titles of "Valedictorian" and "Salutatorian" are awarded to the two honors graduating students who have the highest and second-highest cumulative GPAs, respectively.

## SERVICE LEARNING

CMIS believes that service learning initiatives help prepare students for their role as global citizens. Students in Grades 9 to 12 are required to complete at least 60 hours of service in the global community in order to graduate. Many of our students go above and beyond this minimum.
